STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT - FLARE LITERACY STRATEGY

Today our staff are undertaking their first day of professional learning with the FLARE Literacy Strategy. Our school has joined all Catholic Primary Schools across the Ballarat Diocese looking into literacy practices and



approaches that best support the growth of our students. The DOBCEL Flare Literacy Strategy has been implemented in Ballarat and is an approach to literacy instruction that applies a systematic, cumulative, explicit and diagnostic methodology to teaching phonology (the system of sounds within our language), sound-symbol relationships, syllables, morphology (the study of words and their parts), syntax (the arrangement of words within sentences) and semantics (the study of meaning in language) from Foundation to Year 6.



School TV Week 3, 2025: FRIENDSHIP & BELONGING

'Learning how to make new friends and keep them involves several skills every young person needs to understand and develop. For some these skills will come very naturally, allowing them to easily move between different



friendship groups, sharing their experiences and opening up to new people. For others, this can be much harder to navigate. Belonging to a group that is like-minded with similar interests is highly beneficial to a young person's wellbeing. It gives them a sense of security thereby helping them to feel valued which in turn builds their confidence.

Positive friendships are an important part of the journey to adulthood. Adult carers can support their child or teenager by providing guidance in the many social and emotional skills required for a healthy relationship. This will help them to obtain, retain and maintain friendships. However, not all friendships are regarded as positive. Sometimes young people develop negative or toxic friendships. Therefore, it is also important for them to learn how to identify, avoid or deal with such a friendship.

Enrolment Information for Prospective 2026 Foundation (Prep) Students

at Catholic Primary Schools in the City of Ballarat

A single enrolment application process is in place for all families seeking Foundation (Prep) enrolment for the 2026 school year at a Catholic primary school within the City of Ballarat (see school list contained in this document), including families with children already in one of the eleven schools. Note that information collected through the enrolment process is collated on a common database shared by the eleven schools.

Families seeking enrolment should follow the steps below to apply by Thursday 22 May 2025.

Application Process

- 1. Contact/visit the website of the school/s you are interested in enrolling your child at see school list.
- 2. Engage with the school's process for conducting information sessions or school tours
- 3. Complete the online Expression of Interest Application for Enrolment form by 4.00pm on Thursday 22 May 2025 by visiting the <u>DOBCEL website</u> (click link). Note that this link will not be live until Monday 10 February 2025 at 9.00am.

Important:

- You will be asked to indicate your first, second and third preference schools.
- You will be required to upload your child's Birth Certificate and Baptism Certificate (if applicable).
- If you are unable to access the online form, contact Danielle at enrollments@dobcel.catholic.edu.au for assistance. Your query will be attended to as soon as possible.

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Concession Application: Family Fee Assistance Scheme

Parents/ Guardians who hold an eligible means-tested Centrelink Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card or Veteran Affairs Gold Card are eligible to apply for support under the Family Fee Assistance Scheme.

Eligible families are charged \$520 per annum (\$10 per week) for school tuition fees. The discount fee covers tuition and capital fees, but does not extend to charges for school camps, book hire or subject levies.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one; or
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder: or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Policy | education.vic.gov.au).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, <u>Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u>: <u>Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

Bright Futures Scholarship - closing soon!

For Year 7 2026 commencement

The Bright Futures Scholarship is currently open to Grade 6 2025 families and closes soon on Thursday 6 February 2025.

This scholarship is for the purpose of supporting students and families who are experiencing financial or personal disadvantage, and who demonstrate a strong commitment to social justice activities and contribute to their local community but may not otherwise be able to afford a Catholic education.

This scholarship is awarded annually to one incoming Year 7 2026 student for 50% tuition relief and is awarded for the duration of a student's enrolment at Damascus College (maximum of 6 years).

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must be seeking to attend Damascus for Year 7 2026. Applicants must also have submitted an Enrolment Application Form to Damascus College by the advertised deadline, and ants are selected based on the selection criteria on the website
